

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: "THE FIRST WAVE"; Dr. Nathalie Dougé takes us through her journey of hope and Humanity through the first wave of the COVID pandemic.



Dr. Nathalie Dougé is a board-certified physician in internal medicine. A first-generation Haitian American who is the first in her family to become a physician, receiving her medical degree from the Penn State College of Medicine. She completed her medical training at Montefiore Medical Center Moses-Weiler internal medicine residency program. During the first wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in New York, she served as a hospitalist and assistant professor in the Department of Medicine at the Long Island Jewish Medical Center, an affiliate of Northwell Health. She participated in the 2021 critically acclaimed National Geographic documentary, The First Wave. Since then, she has transitioned her medical practice to performing locum tenens work at different health care systems throughout the U.S. She is a member of the Board of Directors for the Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation. She has been featured in media outlets, such as ABC's Nightline, Fortune magazine, Esquire magazine, and the podcasts, Quitted and Healthy Community News



New York State Inspector General Lucy Lang is a lifelong New Yorker, an attorney, and an educator. She previously served as Director of the Institute for Innovation in Prosecution, a national non-profit, and as an Assistant District Attorney in Manhattan, where she investigated and prosecuted violent crimes including domestic violence and homicides and served as Special Counsel for Policy and Projects. Inspector General Lang is a graduate of Swarthmore College and Columbia Law School, where she was the Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Gender and Law and has served as a Lecturer-in-Law. She was named a Rising Star by the New York Law Journal in 2015, was selected as a Presidential Leadership Scholar in 2017, was a 2019 Aspen Society Fellow, and in 2020 received the Elizabeth Hurlock Beckman Award from the American Psychological Association for her work as an educator who inspired her students to make a difference in their communities. She was appointed to and served on the New York State Bar Association Task Forces on Racial Injustice Chair of the American Bar Association Criminal Justice Section, a member of the Council on Criminal Justice, and a Term Member of the Council on Foreign Relations. She has published articles in the New York Times, The Atlantic, the New York Daily News, and many others, and is the author of March Onl, a children's book about the 1915 women's march.




